Senator PJ Prosper holds first of several King Charles III Coronation Medal Ceremony

Membertou, NS – Sen. Paul "PJ" Prosper held the first of several events his office has organized to award the King Charles III Coronation Medal. The medal was commissioned to commemorate the outstanding contributions of Canadians to their communities and country.

While every parliamentarian was allotted 20 medals to award, Sen. Prosper is grateful that he was gifted the entire allotment from now-retired Nova Scotia Senator Stephen Greene and 6 medals from fellow Mi'kmaw Senator Judy White (Newfoundland). Given that there was no Senator appointed to the Chamber at the time of the medals being issued, Sen. Prosper's list includes 4 Inuit recipients.
